



The Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) will stage its largest annual fundraising event, with the 2014 Wings for Life ball to be held at the Adelaide Entertainment Centre on Saturday 31 May.

The annual black tie gala ball in support of the Flying Doctors is an eagerly awaited date on the social calendar, with last year's 'Snow Ball' themed event selling out almost 900 seats in record time.

Once again, the RFDS promises a spectacular evening featuring a unique soon-to-be announced theme, high quality food and beverages, and leading Australian entertainment and support artists.

Past Wings for Life balls have featured artists including Marcia Hines, Hoodoo





Gurus, Jon Stevens, Beccy Cole, Renee Geyer & Daryl Braithwaite, Bjorn Again and Tom Burlinson & Band.

Over more than a decade, the Wings for Life ball has established a reputation as one of Adelaide's most spectacular, entertaining and successful charity events.

The ball raises much needed funds for RFDS Central Operations, which services an area of 2.3 million square kilometres across South Australia and the Northern Territory.

Since 1928 the RFDS has been providing 24-hour emergency medical services taking the finest care to the furthest corners of Australia

Operating a fleet of 63 aircraft located at 21 bases, the RFDS is the largest and most

comprehensive aeromedical organisation in the world.

Every year the RFDS helps more than 290,000 Australians - the equivalent of someone every two minutes — through services including emergency aeromedical evacuations and the transfer of patients from regional and country hospitals to higher levels of care in city areas.

The RFDS delivers services well beyond its traditional aeromedical roles, providing fly-in GP clinics to small communities and station properties, the transport of allied health professionals, preventative health and lifestyle programs, oral health care service for communities where there is no resident dentist and a wide range of health education and training services.



















RFDS Central Operations operates a fleet of 14 Pilatus PC-12 aircraft, 11 of which are aeromedically equipped as 'flying intensive care units'.

Three aircraft are in a commuter configuration for transport of allied health professionals, including diabetes educators, speech pathologist, occupational therapists and those involved in the management of mental health issues.

Built in Switzerland, the PC-12 has been in use by the RFDS since 1995 and provides an excellent platform the delivery of the organisation's services in often demanding conditions.

RFDS Central Operations has aeromedical bases in Adelaide, Port Augusta and Alice

Springs, in addition to a health service in

The Port Augusta base is also home to the state-of-the-art RFDS Operations Control Centre, which undertakes all communication and aircraft/crew coordination across the Central Operations service area in South Australia and the Northern Territory.

Women in Super Mother's Day Classic is Australia's largest breast cancer research fundraiser, and organisers are calling on regional Australia to get on board in the fight against a disease that impacts one in 8 women.

In 2013, a record \$5 million was raised by 135,000 supporters at 74 events around Australia, including a landmark 63 regional events.

Mother's Day Classic national chair, Louise Davidson, wants to build on this wonderful support from regional Australia, saying no location is too remote or too small to host an event.

"Participants will tell you there is something special about the atmosphere at the

Mother's Day Classic, whether it be a huge capital city event or a smaller community gathering in locations such as Dalby, Weipa and Kangaroo Island," Ms Davidson said.

"All you need is a local park or circuit, some walking shoes and a group of people to come together to walk or run to raise money for vital research."

Ms Davidson said that holding a Mother's Day Classic event was also a wonderful way to show support and solidarity to those in the community dealing with breast cancer.

The diagnosis is tough for anyone, but there can be extra challenges for rural and regional patients. Sheree McLeod, an MDC 2013 community ambassador from Tieri in central Queensland, says: "living rural means lots of travel and relying on my family to come long distances to look after the kids.





There's also the financial burden and strain of having to travel thousands of kilometres for chemotherapy and specialist treatment for problems such as lymphaedema".

"Anyone, rural or big city, can be affected and the more we raise funds now, the closer we get to stomping out this disease. Every dollar helps - at the 2013 MDC I walked two days after having chemo as I was determined to raise funds," Sheree said.

MAKE MOTHER'S DAY MEMORABLE - REGISTER AND FUNDRAISE

Local organisers have until 16 March 2014 to apply to stage a Mother's Day Classic walk or run in their town.

Community organisations, athletics clubs and schools are all welcome to participate.

"We'd like to hear from enthusiastic people willing to start a local event - their efforts will be supported by our national team. It's a great tradition to start with family

and friends," Ms Davidson said.

"Last year first time events were held in locations including Snowy Mountains, Broome, Wonthaggi, Whyalla, Tin Can Bay and Alyangula (Groote Eylandt) - if they can do it, you can too!"

Mother's Day Classic is all about raising awareness and honouring those impacted by the disease, as well as funding vital research into treatment, detection and prevention.

"The more funds we raise, the faster a cure can be found. So instead of just registering this year, why not fundraise? Funding research is a great investment in the future," Ms Davidson said.

"Our online fundraising system and fundraising tips on the website make it easy for people to support you, so get in early and see what you can achieve. There are some great sponsor prizes on offer in each state"

Mother's Day Classic's overall contribution to breast cancer research since the event began in 1998 is a staggering \$19.8 million, making the event Australia's largest funder of National Breast Cancer Foundation research. In that time, 5 year survival rates for women diagnosed with breast cancer have increased to 89%. But, with research, more can be done.

"Mother's Day Classic is a celebration of spirit and hope that together we can contribute to making breast cancer history," Ms Davidson said.

ADVENTURE 1 - BEACHCOMBING

Try your luck looking for hidden treasure on the beautiful beaches of Flinders Island. If treasure chests of jewels are nowhere to be found, cast your eyes around for some of nature's treasure, in particular the soughtafter Paper Nautilus shells (Arganauta Nodosa). These shells are actually a thinwalled egg case secreted by the female Argonauta octopus. Once washed ashore, Paper Nautilus shells become a prize sought by man and seagull.

Visitors, locals and birds all flock to the beaches of Flinders Island in search of this rare treasure. People want the shells intact, while seagulls go straight through the sides to get at any eggs that may remain inside. So if you want your own shell, you have to get up before dawn and start combing the beaches of Flinders Island.

Legend has it that these shells wash up in large numbers every seven years on the West Coast beaches of Flinders Island between March and the end of June.

More information: If the seagulls beat you to them, Killiecrankie Enterprises at Whitemark have Paper Nautilus shells for sale.

ADVENTURE 2 - BUSH WALKING

Flinders Island and the other islands in the Furneaux Group have some of the most beautiful and exciting coastline in Australia. The mountains, in particular Mount Strzelecki, are spectacular with great granite cliffs, rocky ridges, distinctive summits, and forests running down to sandy beaches. You will also find heath lands, wetlands and lagoons.

There are walks to suit everybody from two-hour strolls to extended camping treks such as the Cape Barren circuit.

Local tour operators can provide you with a guide or with transport to the outer islands.

- 5. A scenic flight over Flinders to view some of the 52 Islands of the Furneaux group from the air.

As most bush walkers will be aware minimum environmental impact is as important in the Furneaux region as it is anywhere else. It is important to be well-equipped with maps and drinking waters, and to protect the extremely fragile by keeping to the walking tracks.

- 6. Watch the numerous shore birds from the bird hide at Cameron Inlet. See ducks and swans with ducklings and goslings following close behind on the inlet.
- 7. Explore the sand dunes, look for sharks teeth, old bottles and unique shaped driftwood and please leave them where you find them.
- 8. Watch thousands of soldier crabs scurrying across the sand at Patriarch Inlet.
- 9. Fish for flathead at Tobias Furneaux lookout.
- 10. Get to see local wildlife up close at the Patriarch Wildlife Sanctuary



A driving tour is a great day trip, with about a 120 km round trip and plenty of time for long walks and sightseeing. Start at Lady Barron, the working port of Flinders Island, set within the dramatic landscape of Franklin Sound with the peaks of Cape Barren Island beyond. Yellow and White beaches provide safe swimming close to town. To



the east you can see and sometimes hear the turbulent and dangerous waters of the Pot Boil. Try the walk from Sydney Cove Park to Yellow Beach. Enjoy walks along the fascinating rock platforms in the Badger Corner conservation area. Visit Unavale Vineyard to sample the locally produced wines.

A custom-built wooden helicopter provides little adventurers with a birds-eye view of the savannah as they look for injured animals and load up big plush giraffe, lions and zebra into the helicopter and transport them to the field hospital for treatment.

Under the canvas roof of the field hospital, complete with a surgery and research area, budding vets diagnose, treat and care for injured plush animals. Surgeries are completed and animals are bandaged up before being returned to the wild.

The space also includes a shadow puppet theatre where kids can put on their own shows and opens up into the Zoo's Leopard Tortoise exhibit, providing kids with the perfect spot to get up close to these amazing animals and try on a shell for size.

"Ranger Kids is incredibly interactive, which makes it a very powerful way for kids to connect with wildlife and to learn about the threats to these animals in the wild", Ms Lewis said.

These holidays, visitors can help the Zoo in their mission to preserve wildlife habitat and save the critically endangered Grevy's

Zebra through the Beads for Wildlife campaign.

As part of this campaign Zoos Victoria sell beautiful hand-crafted beadwork created by women in the Melako Community Conservancy in Northern Kenya. Beadwork creates a sustainable alternative livelihood for families, reducing the reliance on livestock and their impact on natural resources and wildlife.

Beads for Wildlife has generated more than \$300,000 for those families in Northern Kenya and livestock numbers have decreased dramatically.

Throughout the Autumn school holidays Ranger Kids will open from 11am – 3pm and it will become a permanent play space at Werribee Open Range Zoo.

"From fuelling up the helicopter for a field survey to scrubbing up for surgery on a lion, Ranger Kids will not only give kids a hands-on experience of what's it's like to be a ranger or a vet, they'll also have a huge amount of imaginative fun" Ms Lewis said.

Ranger Kids is divided into three themed areas – an African village, the savannah and the field hospital, with each revealing the close relationship and between people and wildlife.

Against the backdrop of an African sunset, children in the Melako village will tend to their farms, planting crops, checking their fences, preparing food for their livestock and creating beautiful beadwork.






